LOOKS LIKE TROUBLE
A cartoon once showed the foreman of a jury giving the lunch order to the bailiff. You know the jury is in for a long time when you hear the order: "Eleven cheeseburgers and one hot dog. Eleven coffees and one hot chocolate. Eleven fruit pies and one prune Danish."

A mother was helping her son one day with his spelling assignment & they came to the words *conscious* and *conscience*. She asked her son, "Do you know the difference between these two words?"
He immediately replied, "Sure, Mom. *Conscious* is when you are aware of something. And, *conscience* is when you wish you weren't."
The conscience is like a sharp square peg in our hearts. When we are confronted by a situation that calls for a right-or-wrong decision, that square peg begins to turn. Its corners cuts into our hearts, warning us with an inward "knowing" that we are facing a situation in which we must make a choice against evil & for good.
If the conscience is ignored time after time, however, the corners of the square are gradually worn down, and it becomes a circle that twists & turns at will. When that circle turns within our hearts, there is no inner sensation of warning. In effect, we are left without a conscience.
A sound conscience is truly a gift from God. Heed its warning signals early and you will be spared much pain and heartache. (Copied)
